

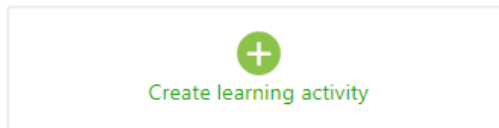
## Page Resource

A page resource is used to provide information on the course page that may be fairly long. Instead of having all of it appear (like a label resource), it shows the first few lines and has a “Read more” button to click to see all of the information. The main reason for using a page resource is to limit vertical scrolling students have to do within each section. A great use for a page resource is your unit overview and learning outcomes.

Just like with the label or book resources, the text you type can be formatted using **highlighting**, **different font colors**, **font sizes**, **FONT TYPES**, etc. You can even add an **image** and a hyperlink to a web page or saved file.

To insert a Page resource on a course page:

1. It is best to first be in the section of the course where you want the link to appear.
2. Then choose “Create learning activity” (located at the bottom of each section in your course) to add the Page resource.



Once the Page resource is inserted into the section, you can [move it](#) to where you want it to appear in the section (or even to a different section).

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## Recommended settings for a Page resource

**Name** Type name of the link students see

**Description**

**DO NOT** type anything in the Description window.

Set activity completion to "Show activity as complete when conditions are met" so students see a check mark beside the link once they have viewed the web page.

Click the Toolbar Toggle button to see the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> rows of the toolbar.

Type or insert what you want to appear on the course page in the **Page content** window, not the Description window.

The toolbar has a large selection of formatting choices to apply to the words you type.

Save and return to course

Click **Save and return to course** once all settings are made.

Save and return to course

Click **Save and return to course** once all settings are made.

You can highlight words in your text and make a hyperlink to a web page or a saved file by clicking the Insert/edit link button.

Although you can insert an image in a Page resource, **it is not advisable.**

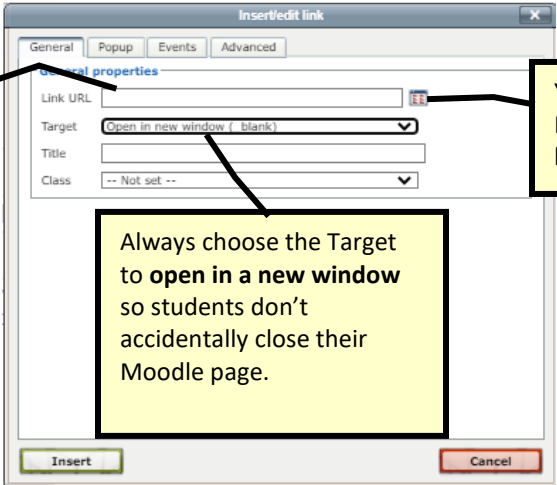
No matter where you insert the image, it appears in an awkward place and you have no control over how large the image will look on the course page.

## Help if making a hyperlink

When you click the Insert/edit link button., this window appears. You can type or copy/paste a URL address here.

You could also click this Browse button and insert a link to saved file.

Always choose the Target to **open in a new window** so students don't accidentally close their Moodle page.

This is the link name students will see.

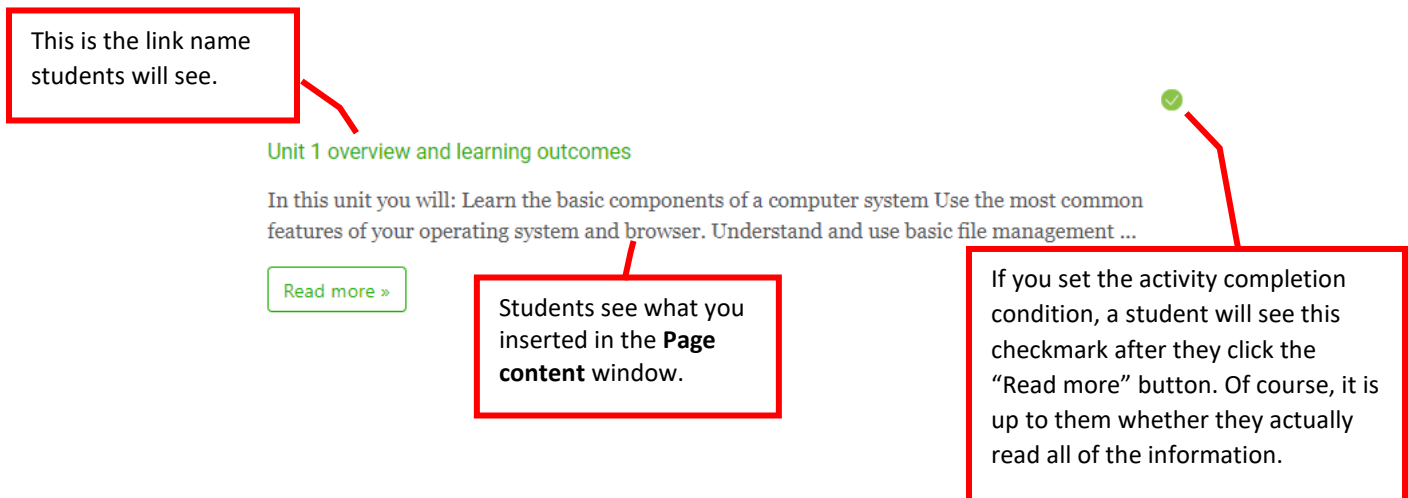

Inserting images in a Page resource is **not advised**.

The main problem is that you have little or no control of how large the image will appear on the course page, so it could cause a lot of unnecessary vertical scrolling..
