## Page Resource

A page resource is used to provide information on the course page that may be fairly long. Instead of having all of it appear (like a label resource), it shows the first few lines and has a "Read more" button to click to see all of the information. The main reason for using a page resource is to limit vertical scrolling students have to do within each section. A great use for a page resource is your unit overview and learning outcomes.

Just like with the label or book resources, the text you type can be formatted using highlighting, different font colors, font sizes, FONT TYPES, etc. You can even add an image and a hyperlink to a web page or saved file.


To insert a Page resource on a course page:

- 1. It is best to first be in the section of the course where you want the link to appear.
- 2. Then choose "Create learning activity" (located at the bottom of each section in your course) to add the Page resource.




Once the Page resource is inserted into the section, you can <u>move it</u> to where you want it to appear in the section (or even to a different section).


