

## Use Open Grader to view rubrics and other instructor feedback

If your instructor has included some type of rubric to grade an assignment, you can view it before working on the activity as well as after the assignment has been graded. Looking at it before submitting your work will help you know the exact criteria your instructor will use to grade the assignment.

These examples demonstrate the different types of rubrics that may be used.

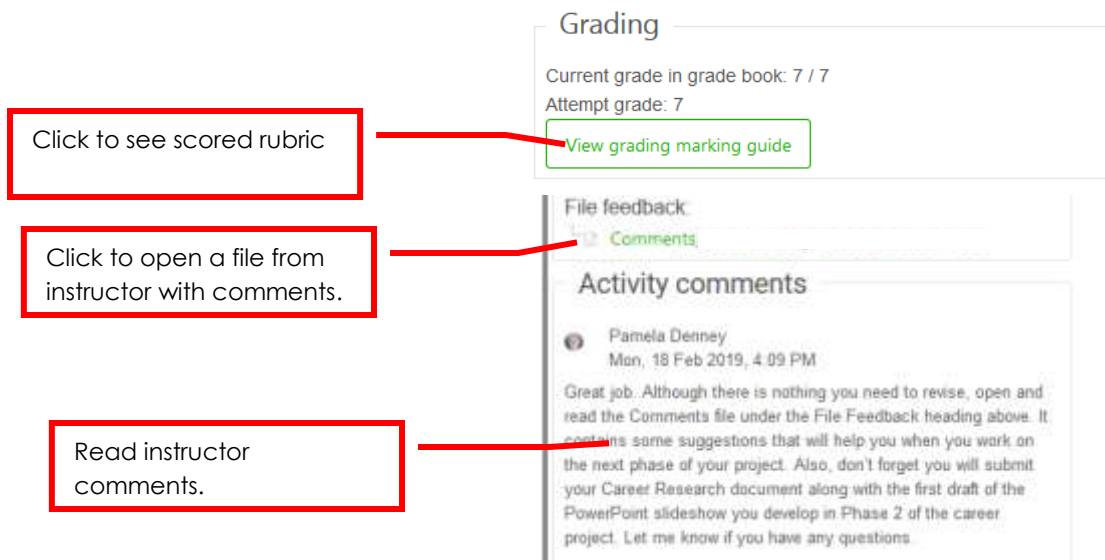
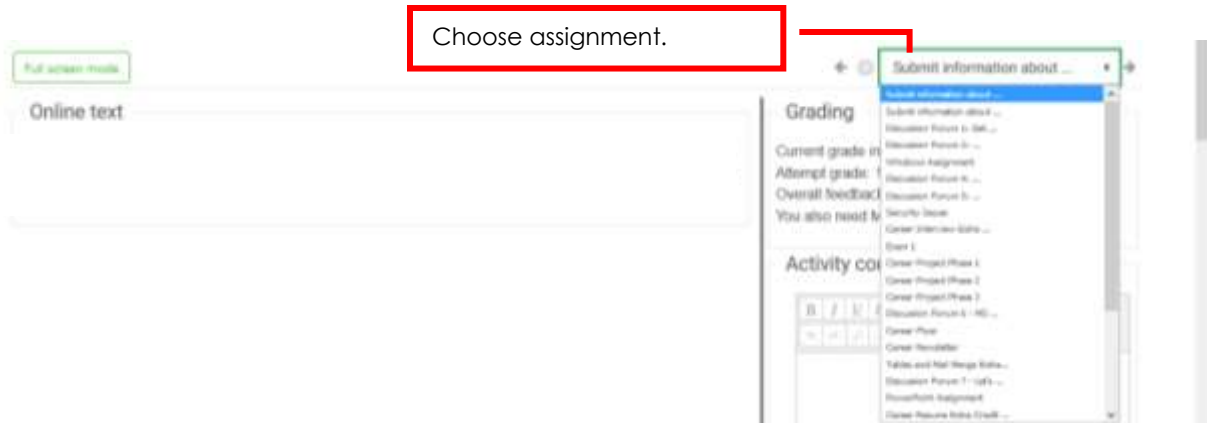

<b>Examples</b>	Student included 1 or two examples and/or specific data in response to the topic area. 8 points	Student included 2 or 3 examples and/or specific data in response to the topic area. 7 points	Student included more than 3 examples and/or specific data in response to the topic area. 2 points
<b>Quality</b>	Student did not demonstrate professional depth and quality. 8 points	Student demonstrated adequate professional depth and quality. 7 points	Student demonstrated outstanding professional depth and quality. 2 points
