

## View rubric before submitting a discussion forum or after it has been graded

If your instructor has included some type of rubric to grade a discussion forum, you can view it before working on the activity as well as after the forum has been graded. Looking at it before submitting your work will help you know the exact criteria your instructor will use to grade the forum.

These examples demonstrate the different types of rubrics that may be used.

<b>Original Posting</b>	Student did not respond to the questions or the assignment. 0 points	Student partially responded to the questions or directions specified in the assignment. 7 points	Student directly responded to the questions or directions specified in the assignment. 2 points
<b>Understanding</b>	Student did not show evidence that he/she read and understood the assigned reading selection. 0 points	Student partially showed evidence that he/she read and understood the assigned reading selection. 7 points	Student showed evidence that he/she read and understood the assigned reading selection. 2 points
<b>Examples</b>	Student included 1 or less examples and/or specific ideas in regards to the topic listed. 0 points	Student included 2 or 3 examples and/or specific ideas in regards to the topic listed. 7 points	Student included more than 3 examples and/or specific ideas in regards to the topic listed. 2 points
<b>Quality</b>	Student did not demonstrate professional depth and quality. 0 points	Student demonstrated adequate professional depth and quality. 7 points	Student demonstrated outstanding professional depth and quality. 2 points

<b>Completeness</b>	
Included all required items	4 points
Used correct spelling	3 points
Used correct grammar	3 points
